



Based on State guidance and local considerations, at this time the following Monterey County residents are eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccine:


- Health care workers, long-term care residents, and emergency services personnel

On April 15, all Monterey County residents age 16 years and older will be eligible to make an appointment for COVID-19 vaccination.

Vaccine supplies are extremely limited. Not everyone eligible for vaccination may be able to schedule an appointment until supplies increase.


